

WAYNE-WESTLAND COMMUNITY SCHOOLS SECTION 105 INTRA-COUNTY SCHOOLS OF CHOICE (ICSOC) PROGRAM

I understand the following conditions related to the Section 105 Schools of Choice Program for Wayne-Westland Community Schools:

- If any of the information provided by me during the application and registration process is false, I will be liable for all costs incurred by the District and my student will be immediately removed from Wayne-Westland Community Schools.
- If an overcrowding situation occurs or if the need arises to change the boundaries of any school for the
 purpose of redistricting and students need to be transferred to another elementary building in
 Wayne-Westland Community Schools, Section 105 Schools of Choice Program students will be transferred
 first.
- 3. Transportation to and from school is the responsibility of the student/parent/guardian. No school district transportation will be provided, Section 105 Schools of Choice Program students.
- 4. When students enroll through Section 105 Schools of Choice Program at the elementary level, the District may make specific school assignments it deems necessary during the student's educational career.
- 5. Section 105 Schools of Choice Program students are not allowed to participate in In-District Schools of Choice since that option is for resident students only.
- 6. ICSOC students who have applied, been accepted, and enrolled for the second semester, MUST be in attendance by January 24, 2025. If the approved student DOES NOT attend, they will be ineligible to attend WWCSD.
- 7. Students are expected to arrive and depart from school on time. Students who are excessively absent or tardy could be asked to return to their home district. It is expected that parents/guardians will pick up students in a timely fashion after school or when they are attending an after school event. Schools do not provide free childcare. A fee-based after school childcare program is available in most schools.
- 8. Once a student is accepted in Wayne-Westland's Section 105 Schools of Choice Program, the following year siblings will have priority for identified Schools of Choice slots. Sibling priority is defined as having two children in the same school at the same time. Just like other applicants, siblings have access to the same building only if slots are available.
- 9. The District recommends that Section 105 Schools of Choice Program students making the transition from elementary school to middle school or middle school to high school accompany cohorts to the feeder(s) school (s). However, the district reserves the right to place students at another school building based on feeder school capacity.
